

Committee to allow a party, without any statutory authority, to choke off access to the process entirely, denying individual party members and write-in candidates of any party affiliation the opportunity to present themselves before Green Party members and solicit their votes. Absent statutory authority or a court order, we will advise local elections officials to comply with the Elections Code provisions permitting qualified members of the Green Party to ask the nominations of their party for all offices on the June 1992 primary election ballot. It is critical that any legal challenges to our position in these matters be resolved as soon as possible. The nomination period for candidates (including political party county central committee candidates) seeking to have their names placed on the June 1992 primary election ballot commenced February 10, 1992. Candidates for legislative office must file declarations of intention by February 18, 1992. In order to help ensure the fair and efficient conduct of the June Primary election, elections officials and potential candidates must know within the next few days whether county central committee and state elections contests are to appear on the ballot. If you wish to pursue these issues in court, please do so immediately.
